Gold Rush Season 3 – Raw TV for Discovery (1 x 60 min) Redemption Road.

Out of Indian River paydirt, Todd comes up with a risky plan to hit his 1,000 ounce goal. A bad fall puts Fred out the game, leaving Dustin to dig the glory hole. Parker worries his season is over but his grandpa is convinced he's near the motherlode.

Gold Rush Season 3 – Raw TV for Discovery (1 x 60 min) Million Dollar.

This season someone hits the mother lode. Todd doubles down with two claims, twice the crew and twice the gear. Dakota Fred's glory hole is thought to contain millions in gold. Parker hires a new crew and sets his sights on new land.

Gold Rush Season 2 – Raw TV for Discovery (1 x 60 min) Frozen Out.

The Hoffman crew battles frozen dirt and frozen pipes as they struggle to hit their goal of 100oz. Parker makes a last ditch effort at Smith Creek Hill and the Dakota Boy's season may be over when Dustin smashes the side of the washplant.

Gold Rush Season 2 – Raw TV for Discovery (1 x 60 min) Drill or Die.

A crew rebellion forces Todd Hoffman to dig test holes on the claim. The tension mounts as they wait to see if they're sitting on a gold-rich paystreak or about to go bust.

Storm City 3D – Pioneer Productions for Sky 3D / Sky Atlantic / Nat Geo

Using advanced engineering technology and science, a team of experts set out to recreate the impact of natural forces to investigate what the effects are.

Catastrophes; Birth of the Universe - Pioneer Prod for C4 & Discovery (1 x 50 min)

In October 1982, 5 people got caught in a tropical storm. When their yacht sinks, they must survive in the middle of the Atlantic Ocean on a raft with no survival equipment. To their absolute horror, they find the area of the ocean to be infested with sharks. (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Grand Canyon - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

Twenty five year old nurse Linda Forney and her pet dog Cocoa Gin set off to explore one of the seven natural wonders of the world - the Grand Canyon. On route to a native Indian village she takes a wrong turn and ends up lost, alone and with no food or water. (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Escape from the Amazon - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

Could you beat the elements and avoid death? Would you know what to do? Join jungle guide Myke Hawke in the Amazon as he wrestles anacondas, spots deadly poisons, and tries to survive -- and make it out alive.. (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Alaskan Adventure - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

Two climbers and close friends are scaling an ice-wall near Alaska's Mount Johnson when Jim falls down and suffers some major injuries. Dave attempted to create a makeshift SOS signal, though when a passing light aircraft attempts to land to rescue the injured man, the landing gear on the plane breaks and the pilot and his pregnant wife become stranded in the icy wasteland as well. (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Zambezi - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

The story of an African family's fight for survival when they are thrown into one of the most crocodile infested rivers in the world...after their fishing boat is attacked by a hippo. (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Kayaking - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

Two best friends decide to go kayaking in order to tour Washington State's San Juan Islands. However, when they become victim to stormy conditions, the novice kayaker is forced into the Pacific Ocean while his friend manages to fight against the storm and he heads back towards land, though will he really leave his friend behind? (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Shipwrecked - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

When three friends decide to head to the Amazon looking to find some adventure, they come across a local guide who holds a map to find some forgotten native villages. The four head out into the Amazon though soon the unexpected occurs. (Interviews editor)

I Shouldn't be Alive: Ice Cave survivor - Darlow Smithson for Discovery/C4/Granada (1 x 50 min)

An experienced American Air Force officer, decides to take his son on a skiing trip in Turkey. A sudden snowstorm wrecks havoc and they are forced to spend a night in a cave without any supplies or food. After a week inside of the cave, the father is faced with the decision of staying with his son or to leaving in hopes of finding help. (Interviews editor)

Observational documentary about the elderly passengers of the QE2 cruise ship.
